

Discover the Southern Purple Spotted Gudgeon

Mogurnda adspersa

Appearance

What do they look like?

Purple spots on a greyish-brown body. They have a long, slender shape and can grow up to 15 cm long.

Habitat

Where do they live?

Found in slow-moving rivers, streams, and billabongs. Prefer habitats with lots of vegetation and submerged logs.

Diet

What do they eat?

Insects, small crustaceans, and other tiny aquatic creatures.

Behaviour

How do they behave?

Often hide among plants and debris. Can be territorial, especially during breeding season.

Conservation Status

Are they endangered?

Considered vulnerable due to habitat loss and pollution. Conservation efforts are in place to protect their habitats.
