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Sea Turtles: The Travellers

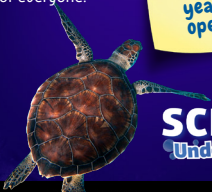
Sea turtles travel thousands of kilometres across the ocean, spreading nutrients and keeping seagrass healthy by eating it.
